

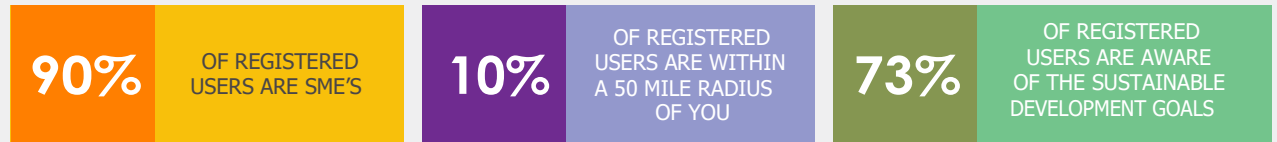
SOCIAL VALUE IN YOUR SUPPLY CHAIN

Data from the tool can be used in a range of ways, including supporting improved communications and reporting. Below we provide an example of a visual communication developed using data from the tool. This infographic has been created to demonstrate the contribution of procurement and an organisation's suppliers to the social value and sustainability agenda.

Evidence of action taken from the action plans of suppliers using the Tool:

- We have our own "apprentice Academy" inhouse. Three apprentices have worked through their training are now full-time employee's. We have two new Apprentices working through their training
- We employ from Ground Force a local not for profit organisation that aids long term unemployed people back into work.
- We have worked closely with customers such as Kirklees, North Lincolnshire and Leeds Councils to support employment opportunities with disadvantaged groups. For example, we contracted George's Crypt, a well-known Leeds based charity for the homeless to provide all our onsite catering on a recent scheme.
- We offer employability training, coaching and work placements for young NEETs engaged in The Prince's Trust 'Team' employability programme nationally.
- We engage with our supply chain to highlight any trainee, apprentice or employment opportunities that are then shared with the Local Authority (NCC)
- We are in the process of improving the condition of our warehouse yard and the ground area in front of the offices. This work has been completed and is on a program to be attended on a regular basis.

SOCIAL VALUE IN YOUR SUPPLY CHAIN

There are 23 pre-populated issues presented in the tool linked with 73 pre-populated actions. All of these issues and actions align to the Sustainable Development Goals and the environmental, social and economic priorities of the public sector. This allows you to regularly review the data and demonstrate the value and positive impact of the supply chain, whilst helping you target any future supplier engagement activity.
